

**CUT BANK CITY COUNCIL
JUNE 6, 2016
CITY HALL**

CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

City Council President Tim Curtiss called the meeting of the Cut Bank City Council to order at 6:30 PM, Monday, June 6, 2016. The following Council members answered roll call: Kevin Quinlan, Timothy Curtiss, Donovan Grubb and Kelly Solberg. Also present were City Clerk-Treasurer Linda Burley, City Attorney Robert Smith and City Superintendent James Suta. All present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

VISITORS: Tanya Harper, Katie Zarn, and Nicholas Bradford and Amie Allison of Glacier County EMS.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: None

CLAIMS:

Councilperson Grubb made a motion to approve the claims through June 2, 2016 in the amount of \$106,532.14. Councilperson Quinlan seconded the motion. The motion was approved 4-0.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:

Councilperson Solberg requested a discussion of the flowers and planters.

CONSENT AGENDA:

Councilperson Solberg made a motion to approve the May 16, 2016 minutes and the May 19, 2016 Payroll of \$81,693.93 and the June 2, 2016 payroll of \$70,993.72. Councilperson Grubb seconded the motion. The motion carried 4-0.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

City Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent Suta reported that the pool will open June 8, 2016 but the Splash Park will not open until next week. There are still many large items that have been discarded in alleys and now that clean up days have concluded; it is the responsibility of the residents to properly haul these large objects to the roll off site.

Councilperson Grubb made a motion to approve the City Superintendent's report. Councilperson Curtiss seconded the motion. The motion was approved 4-0.

OLD BUSINESS:

Zoning Ordinance – City Attorney Smith has received the information from Building Inspector Yeagley and is in the process of completing it. Item was tabled until the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Tanya Harper: Ms. Harper requested permission to allow open containers in the parking lot of the Pioneer Bar on June 18, 2016. She will be hosting a Summer Party and plans to have games in the private parking lot.

Councilperson Curtiss moved to allow open containers in the Pioneer Bar parking lot on June 18, 2016. Councilperson Quinlan seconded the motion. Motion carried with a vote of 4-0.

Glacier County EMS: Nicholas Bradford, Glacier County EMS, reported that they have already raised some funds for the handicap accessible playground equipment and will be raising more this summer with the Fun Run. He asked for the Council's input as to where to place the equipment. Superintendent Suta stated that the South West Park is the best choice since there is more room there than in the other parks. The equipment will need a spot approximately 60' by 35'.

Councilperson Curtiss moved to accept the playground equipment and have the City set it up. Councilperson Solberg seconded the motion and it passed with a vote of 4-0.

Councilperson Solberg moved to approve Resolution 16-16 Budgetary Authority Resolution for Treasure State Endowment Program Grant. Councilperson Grub seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

First Reading of Ordinance 16-2 Regulating curfew of minors and responsibilities of adults having care and custody of minors.

Ordinance 16-2 was read by City Attorney Robert A. Smith. Councilperson Grubb moved that the first reading of Ordinance 16-2 be approved. Councilperson Curtiss seconded the motion and motion passed with a vote of 4-0.

WORK SESSION:

Councilperson Curtiss would like to see the antique fire truck brought to surrounding area parades. It has in the past been driven in events in Conrad, Shelby, Valier and Browning. North American Indian Days is July 7-10, 2016 and the Marias Fair Parade will be held July 23, 2016.

Councilperson Solberg reported that she received a call from Betty Richter at the Flower Shop. Ms. Richter asked if we could see that the flowers are picked up as she does not have the room to store them. Councilperson Solberg picked up twelve baskets and brought some to local businesses and planted others.
